

Slippery Outside! As the weather keeps getting colder, be prepared for slippery sidewalks outside. Here are some tips:

- Plan ahead! Make sure you have plenty of time.
- Wear shoes or boots that provide as much traction as possible!
- Use special care when entering and exiting vehicles, climbing or descending stairs, entering or leaving buildings.
- Take small, short steps and shuffle as much as possible.
- Be prepared to fall. If you fall, fall with sequential contacts at your thigh, hip and shoulder. Avoid using outstretched arms to brace yourself. You can even practice falling in advance!

Please let staff know if you see unsafe sidewalks around the building. We will try to keep all walkways salted and de-iced! Stay safe out there.
